## Q & A

### What is the RNZN Association?

The Association in its current form arose from an amalgamation in 2007 of the Ex-Royal Naval Men's Association and the RNZN Association (previously the Naval Association Christchurch). It is a national grouping of Branches, led by a National Council.

### What does the RNZN Association do?

Branches meet regularly, some in their own clubrooms, to:

- Preserve and maintain the comradeship that began in naval service
- Look after the welfare of members and provide support where it is needed
- To support the Royal New Zealand Navy

Branches conduct their own social, sporting and support programmes to achieve these objectives.

### How much does it cost?

Branches set their own subscriptions at their Annual General Meeting.

### Do they have rules?

The national body and the branches are all properly formed organisations, usually Incorporated Societies or Registered Charities. Consequently they all have appropriate rules governing membership, finances and other matters. These rules are openly available.

### Is it part of the Royal New Zealand Navy?

It is independent however, fully supported by the Navy and the Chief of Navy serves as the Patron. Serving personnel often give talks to Branch meetings that provide updates on current RNZN activities.

### Can women join?

Absolutely.

### What is its connection with the RSA?

We are affiliated to RNZRSA.

### Do I have to join for a set term?

You can renew your membership on an annual basis. So join now, and experience the continuing comradeship of the Navy family.
